We're Raising a Barn!

After heavy fruit losses due to a late frost we are so happy to share some good news.

Thanks to a Food Security Infrastructure Grant we are kicking off the construction of our new apple barn.

Since 2007 we've been restoring the old orchard; this is the next big step. The new food-safe barn will serve our community for potentially hundreds of years.

This facility will house state-of-the-art apple storage, cider capacity, and a production kitchen for farm goodies.



The Labyrinth on Park Hill

At Park Hill Orchard the beauty and bounty of this land continues to be explored through flora, sculpture, theatrical performances, music and dance.

Six years ago Gerald Clark, a multi-faceted artist, herbalist and stone mason, enhanced the labyrinth below the farm stand by planting medicinal herbs. This year's presentation of the labyrinth seeks to be a refuge for all creatures.

As an active herbal garden, it supports pollinators and people. Benches and stone-based Adinkras, symbols from Ghana that represent concepts or aphorisms, have been added throughout the labyrinth in places that are particularly conducive to healing, meditation, and exploration.

Come share some quiet space alongside the birds, praying mantises, and honey bees.
